## Introducing the Characters - Mary

**Mary** is the central character of Book 1 and her story is loosely based on the life of my great, great, great grandmother. When I learned this it set me wondering how she survived in the 1840s with no welfare state and little chance of work.

My first thought was that she must have ended up in the workhouse, but when I could find no evidence of that I had to come up with other scenarios. I know that at the time of her husband's death she lived with (or close to) his family in rural Staffordshire. I also know she moved to Birmingham at some point. Why she did that I will never know.

Using other snippets of information I'd discovered, I aimed to piece together a story that could resemble the truth. As I had no knowledge of her existence before tracing my family history, however, a lot of it is guesswork and I'll never know how realistic it really is. Whatever the facts, the books are very much a piece of fiction and without wanting to run into those spoilers, I'll stop there!
