


# When Time Runs Out: Paperback


I know many of you prefer paperback versions of books and I am hoping to have the print version of *When Time Runs Out* available on Amazon before Christmas.

### From *Hooks & Eyes:* Is it true that Mr Wetherby manufactured Hooks & Eyes?

#### He did!

Depending on how far you've got through the series, you're likely to have differing views of Mr Wetherby. From my research, however, one thing seems clear. He was a very dedicated and determined man.

I found an old newspaper clipping that gave an insight into the sort of man he was. He started life in the South West of England (near Gloucester) but apparently, when he was in his early twenties he *walked* to Birmingham, which was over 60 miles away as he didn't have any money to pay for transport.

Once there he started making the hooks and eyes fasteners we are still familiar with today. At one point he was one of the largest manufacturers of them in Birmingham (which probably also means the UK). I have heard reports that he invented them although I am yet to confirm that.

He subsequently branched out into buttons and the manufacture of brass ornaments, but he never left hooks & eyes. When he died, many years later, he was a very wealthy man.
